Dear CCS Parents and Students,

Most of you are aware of the scare we experienced recently with our daughter, Lauryn, who is thirteen and in the 8th grade at CCS. On the evening of August 4, Lauryn began experiencing back pain and some numbness in her feet, which progressed quickly to radiating pain in her legs. Within fifteen minutes she was having trouble putting any weight on her legs. Phillip picked her up, and we quickly rushed her to the emergency room at Glenwood.

After spending the night in the ER, Lauryn was transferred to Schumpert Medical Center in Shreveport and placed in the PICU. At this point, Lauryn basically had no control over her lower body from the waist down. All sorts of tests were being done on her; she even had to have her braces removed for an MRI. To say we were all a little scared would be an understatement!

After being evaluated by a pediatric neurologist, Lauryn was diagnosed with and treated for transverse myelitis, an inflammation of the spine that can have numerous causes. The doctor explained that she could not predict how much Lauryn would recover. In studies 1/3 of people experience full recovery, 1/3 experience

moderate recovery, but are left with some lasting impairments, and 1/3 are left with severe disabilities. The doctor explained that she was very worried because Lauryn had several symptoms that might lead her to predict a poorer recovery for her.

After staying at Schumpert for nine days, Lauryn was transferred to Our Children's House at Baylor in Dallas for inpatient rehabilitation, where she received several hours of occupational and physical therapy on a daily basis for four weeks. We are proud to say that she is walking again on her own and is almost fully recovered! We know that God touched Lauryn's body, and we sincerely want to thank all of you who prayed for her healing! The doctors say it was a miracle that she improved so quickly. We know that Lauryn will look back on this experience and remember the faithfulness of our God. She will also remember the love that Family Church and CCS showed to her.

Thank you again for supporting me and my family during this time! It is good to be home!

The CCS elementary music program is a combination of music education, movement through motor skills and teaching of biblical principles through song. Students learn the basics of music by playing recorder instruments and singing. They are introduced to music reading and ear training by learning solfege and other musical and cultural styles. The musical approach to teaching used at CCS is in accordance with the LA Education Benchmarks of Music Education. Our elementary music program participates in the LA American Choral Directors All-State Choir. This auditioned state honor choir is held in Baton Rouge in the early fall. The choirs participate in the Christmas Concert series at Pecanland Mall, in addition to singing in the District I Choir Festival Competition. In the spring, students audition for the annual District I Honor Choir held in Quachita Parish. In May, the choirs will rehearse and present a biblically-based musical, teaching and sharing the core values of Kingdom Education principles.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

The middle school music program is a continuation of the music education in the elementary program. Our middle school choir is comprised of students selected for their musical abilities and talents. These students will participate in the selection process for the Louisiana All-State Choir in Baton Rouge. They will prepare music for concerts at both CCS and community events during the Christmas season. In the winter, the middle school prepares for the District I Southern Choral Classic Choir Festival Competition. In the Spring, choir members audition for the annual District I Honor Choir. At the end of the school year, the choir will present a well-staged musical presentation.

Music education is carried to the next level utilizing advanced techniques of ear training and sight-singing.
